Straight away her energy desire and passion to use football as a tool to keep lads on the straight and narrow was clear. She was not about winning at all costs or finding the best players. She was about community inclusion and making people feel part of something positive. 6 years on Mandy has guided the club to developing more and more teams. 2 adult teams, under 18, under 15, under 16, ladies teams and now Twynham tigers for under 9's which features some of the kids from the dads who featured in her first ever team, have all developed and had chances to play in structured football and been part of a dream.

She has brought together councillors, housing officers and police to be part of her committee. She is a matriarchal figure on her estate; a mum, a wife and a grandmother. She works tirelessly fund raising for the club and the local community, she is selfless in her giving and always gives lads who mess up a chance and another chance. She also volunteers with the local search and rescue team giving up her weekends and being called out in the middle of night.

She has won awards for her outstanding contributions BBC sport unsung hero runner up and home office to name a couple.
